This week....we have had lots of fun learning about chickens. We have made stories about chickens, painted chickens, made a register for our chickens and enjoyed seeing our chickens try out their new wings and fly around the classroom. Literacy and Phonics

We have done lots of writing through play this week. We have written plans for our models, stories, registers, lists and labels. All our children like to write at their own level and are excited about writing by themselves.

Some children have really enjoyed researching the Romans and have used non-fiction books to help with their writing.

Mathematics

Some brilliant times tables work this week, counting in twos, fives and tens. We have been exploring halves and quarters and cutting things in half and colouring half of a shape. Some of us made models that were half one colour and half a different colour. We had to make sure that both halves were equal.
